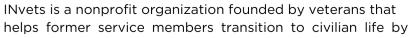
FROM VAN'S VIEW A Message from Savannah Wood, CEO

INITIATIVES WITH IMPACT

Lilly Endowment's \$250 million grant (the largest single award given in the endowment's 86-year history) to the Indiana Economic Development Corporation could be a boon to Evansville! \$185 million of those funds are earmarked to support the redevelopment or rehabilitation of deteriorated properties in communities across the state. Blight is a critical concern in Evansville, impacting public safety, quality of place, surrounding property values, and the ability to attract investment in neighborhoods that need it the most. ECHO Housing & Community Development is rallying our Promise Zone partners, including the Evansville Regional Economic Partnership (E-REP), to craft what we hope to be a successful proposal that ensures our region receives its fair share of this important funding.
