Welcome to March! I hope you have been able to follow all the exciting news we've shared since the start of the year. We recently announced our expansion to eight homeless service programs, with the pending consolidation of the House of Bread and Peace under our umbrella of services. We are thrilled to be trusted with such a critical need in the community and look forward to expanding our impact. Additionally, we are in the beginning phases of a new initiative called the **Evansville Community Development** Collaboration (ECDC). As the lead agency for the Promise Zone designation awarded in 2016, we believe the partnerships and collective impact that has been made should go well beyond the Promise Zone designation, which sunsets in 2026. For these reasons, we are beginning to transition and expand the work into the ECDC, focusing on activity in the areas of physical (housing, streets, sidewalks, structures, etc.), social (healthcare, education, crime, connectedness, etc.), and economic development (jobs, employers, micro-enterprises, entrepreneurs, transportation, childcare, etc.). We have a tremendous group of core community partners formed and are thrilled to include countless others that will work together to impact our community. Stay tuned for a full listing of community partners and details related to the ECDC! Finally, in February we held our first Agency Tenant Council meeting. The council includes individuals that represent each homeless service program in our agency. Our first meeting discussed council expectations and how we can continue to serve individuals experiencing homelessness through the lens and voices of those that have the lived experience - our own residents. We are excited to incorporate our residents into our agency strategy and day to day operations. We will have some additional news unfolding as the year progresses and hope you will share in the excitement with us as it is released. Thank you for your continued support!
