Hello! As we welcome the month of June, I am excited to share updates and reflections on our journey together over the past months. Our community's strength, resilience, and unity continue to inspire and drive our collective efforts toward positive change and growth. The first half of the year has been filled with meaningful progress and successes.

Key accomplishments:

- Relocated our management offices to Downtown Evansville to accommodate our growing team.
- Expanded our staff to include a Social Service Director and Grants Manager to meet the growing needs of our agency and community.
- Announced a new mission, vision, and agency logo, adding orange as a secondary agency color to inspire and promote optimism.
- Began managing the House of Bread and Peace an emergency shelter for women and children.
- Held the first Casual for a Cause awareness day across the community! This year's theme was "Ending Homelessness".
- Established the first Agency Tenant Council with representatives from each homeless service program to ensure their thoughts, voices, and experiences are integrated into our services.
- Awarded funding from IHCDA (State of Indiana) for additional case management providers to better serve some of the most vulnerable individuals in the community.
- Developed a 5-year strategic plan for the agency.
- Initiated a collaborative forum with key leaders and stakeholders of the community to increase engagement and avoid duplicating efforts - awarded funding from CenterPoint Energy to support this effort.
- Awarded funding from the Indiana Dept. of Veteran Affairs to strengthen services to Veterans experiencing homelessness.
- Awarded Key Supportive Services Program of the Year during the Prosperity Indiana Summit.
- Collaborated with the Immigrant Welcome Center to build a Cultural Competency pilot program.
- Developed several agency-based work culture initiatives to strengthen our internal connectedness and rapport and to reinforce the importance of a positive, supportive work environment.

Looking forward we have several exciting things I want to share:

- Promise Home construction complete we will begin housing individuals this summer!
- House of Bread and Peace formally recognized as a program of our agency.
- Selected to present at the National Co-Responders Conference in Omaha, Nebraska.
- Pay It Forward Initiative encouraging & celebrating kindness towards one another.
- Further development of the collaborative forum incorporating grassroots efforts and individual voice stay tuned!
- Selected to present at the CIT International Conference in Indianapolis.
- Golf Outing October 9, 2024

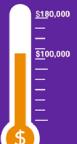
