COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

What started in 2019 as an informal partnership with ECHO Housing & Community Development, the Evansville Police Department, and Southwest Behavioral Healthcare to address the needs of those experiencing mental health crisis, has evolved into what is now recognized as the **E3 Initiative**:

Education, Encouragement, & Enforcement. This initiative recognizes the need for true wraparound services in the community for individuals currently and previously experiencing homelessness. With the same founding team working alongside additional partners, systems and networks, the co-response initiative aims to efficiently and sustainably address barriers that lead to housing instability. The E3 team recently presented the model and practice at the 2024 National Co-Responders Conference in Omaha, NE. Next, the team will visit Indianapolis in August of this year to present at the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) International Conference.
