Collective Action Network (CAN) Summit 2025 Recap

On Wednesday, April 16, a full day of connection, collaboration, and community impact unfolded at the University of Southern Indiana's Carter Hall. Neighbors, advocates, and leaders came together—not just to talk, but to listen, to learn, and to lead. In a room full of possibility, residents took the lead. Their voices, their stories, and their solutions guided the way during a powerful resident-led panel that reminded us: lasting change starts with the people most affected.

Dr. Danielle Varda, our keynote speaker, challenged us to think like network scientists—to recognize the strength of our relationships and how collaboration fuels transformation.

Then, the real work began—in six hands-on breakout sessions designed to spark ideas and inspire action: In "Better Together: Aligning for Impact," we talked about root causes of what is keeping us from truly coming together to celebrate and amplify the good works that are taking place. We would be a stronger city altogether if we weren't busy competing and putting our pride above our community. "The Housing Puzzle" brought together advocates and residents to explore what's missing in our housing system and how we can build a more inclusive housing pipeline. In "Breaking Barriers: Building an Inclusive Community," voices were raised to confront social, civic, and cultural inequities. The group brainstormed solutions rooted in equity and belonging.

"Classrooms and Beyond" challenged us to think bigger about education—recognizing that student success is a community effort that extends far beyond the walls of a school. "Resources: Navigating Help Without the Hassle" gave participants a real look at the challenges residents face in accessing support—and offered hands-on experience with tools that can break those barriers down.

Every room, every discussion, every moment echoed the same truth: real change begins when we build it together. This wasn't just a summit. It was a spark—a shared commitment to doing the work, side by side. Thank you to every resident, every leader, and every partner who showed up to make this vision real. The work continues. And together, we are building the kind of community we all deserve. **Stay tuned on our website for next steps!


